The sourcing and application of colors and materials are purely natural. Five colors white, red, yellow, green, black, known as Pancha Tatwa been used to color the Picture. The white color gets by soaking, drying, and churning seashell, The red extract from a stone named Hingula, a local stone Haritlal used for yellow, Green used from leaves and green stones, and black is obtained from lamp soot, or either from burning coconut shell.120 more colors are used by mixing of the Pancha Tatwa color. The hair of, mouse, buffalo, and Keya roots are used to make the brush for the painting. And tied to a bamboo stick for the brush handle. The flower border on the painting makes it more notable.

Every day cowherds girls used to go to the banks of Yamuna to take a bath. They assemble together holding each other's hands, singing, and bathing, deep in the water. Before going into the water they put their clothes near. Noticing bathing in the river fully naked is disrespectful, Lord Krishna decided to teach them a lesson, so that they may not repeat the mistake. Krishna stole the clothes of the Gopis and told them to come out from the river in the same way as they took bath.

When Gopis urges Lord Krishna to return their clothes back Lord told them that they disrespect and committed an offense by bathing without clothes in the Yamuna. 
Lord Krishna, born in jail, raised by his foster parents, left his childhood divine love, and kill his







The hair of,


mouse, buffalo, and Keya roots are used, for making the brush for painting. It is then tied to a bamboo stick as a handle for the brush. After completion, the canvas is kept over a charcoal fire and lacquer is applied to the surface. The flower border on the painting makes it more extraordinary

Every feature and gesture of him has some spiritual significance. Like in this picture he is seen with a goad in the upper right-hand goad (known as ankusa) which is used on elephants to move faster, signifies Ganesha god direct us to move forward in the righteous path in our life. In the left upper arm holding a noose or paasa which use to control an animal, signifies, Lord Ganesha captures all hardships from the path of his devotee. the rosary in his middle right hand depicts once persuasion of knowledge over spirituality never gets stopped.

With axe in his middle left hand, Lord Ganesha repels the obstacle of his devotee, The broken tusk in his lower right hand illustrates his sacrifice and devotion towards the work one should learn. finally, the sweets in his lower left hand represent a reward for the awakened soul and the right path you moved for. A mouse is seen on his right side with folding hands facing towards his master. 
Lord Ganesha is the son of Lord Shiva and Goddess Parvati. Dancing means Nritya In Sanskrit, as the name suggests Nritya Ganpati is a happy dancer. Represents the joyful and relaxed side of Lord Ganesha among his 32 forms.

His physical feature has different attributes. His big belly contains the whole universe, which he tied up with a serpent the kundalini. His large head represents wisdom and knowledge, his large ears a wise person listens to everything. The two tusks are called **Medha**(intellect) and **Shradha**(faith). The broken tusk is called the Medha and the complete one is called the Shradha, which signifies noteworthy focus towards the ultimate goal. The trunk above his small mouth depicts work more and talk less.

Lord Ganesha holds an Ankush in the right upper arm, which signifies to move on the righteous path his devotee, the upper left-hand bearing noose, which is a symbol that he will capture all the odd and hardship from his devotee's pathway. With axe Lord Ganesha repel the obstacle of his devotee, the rosary in his hand depicts once persuasion of knowledge over spirituality never gets stopped. The broken tusk illustrates his sacrifice and devotion towards his work one should learn from. He dances to the combination of Tandava and Lasya inherited both from his father Lord Shiva and mother Goddess Parvati. With one foot on the ground and another is slightly bent towards the knee represents that a wise person is from earth but not entirely of this earth. A rat is one side looking at him, with a humble eye define the desire and ego has to be under control, otherwise, it will distract and destroy the inner goodness.






